Warm Greetings from the Parsonage!

Now there are also many other things that Jesus did. Were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written. – John 21:25

The Bible is the story of God's conflict and victory over all that that opposes Him. This opposition comes in many forms; the emptiness in the beginning, the Serpent in the Garden, the wickedness of humanity, the waves against the ark, the wilderness around the Tribes, the nations that move against Israel, the supposedly-faithful followers that move against Jesus, the Death that overtakes the God of Life. Yet, each tale ends with God victorious. However, the Bible is not simply a look into the past, but our current lives as well. Although millennia separate us; we find ourselves in the misdeeds, mistakes, and misguided adventures of the past; we find our own struggle and heartache; we find our pain and sorrow. We also find our God, answering the needs of His people and claiming victory over this world. Reading forms a gateway for God to speak into our lives, into our struggles, into the center where He belongs. If Jesus was able to break the power of death, what in our lives can stand against Him? If He has promised to shatter our tombs, what can keep us from living faithfully?

But how do we actually do it? How do we read Scripture?

The Psalter begins by urging us to meditate on the Word of God, day and night. The Psalmist says we will become, "like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper." That word meditate can bring to mind yoga classes, or low-humming, or a gong, but that's not what the Hebrews meant by it. The word the Psalmist uses means to "mutter" or "growl" back to oneself. My mom taught second grade for longer than I'm allowed to tell people. During quiet reading time, she'd give her students whisper phones. They're two PVC pipe corners connected together, one end goes to the ear and other to the mouth. The child reads back to herself, she hears the text, and interacts with it in a way that you don't when you read in your head. That is exactly what the Psalmist is talking about—we are to read aloud so we can interact. The ancients believed that the written word captured the power of spoken word and held it until it was spoken again. Speaking what was written connected you to the original speaker—no matter the distance and time that stood between. The Psalmist doesn't just want us to read but interact with

Scripture; not to glance on the promises, or skim past the pain of this life, but to hear them—hear God's answer to our thirst in a voice so personal it has to be our own. Go and Read! Amen.




Svea Church Happenings

Eidsvold Church Council Meeting May 1, 2025

Present: Mandy, Laura, Lee, Phylis, Pastor Al via phone. Absent: Kendra and Tana.

6 pm call to order by President Mandy.

- 1) Pastor Al led the Opening Prayer
- 2) Previous Meeting Minutes Review and Approval (Annual Meeting Minutes) Lee made a motion to approve as read. Phylis 2nd.
- 3) New Items:
 - a) Worship Committee Recommendation:
- i. Worship Committee continues to meet with all parties in attendance (whenever possible), and all voices are heard and input gathered. Worship Committee has final authority. Late additions or changes will not be considered out of respect for everyone's time, unless external circumstances arise that warrant consideration.
 - b) Services in the park ensure mix of Melody and Phyllis playing. Great idea, no objections!
- c) Tana Langer wages: currently \$13/hr; recommended: \$18.50/hr Eidsvold Council Vote: Phyllis made a motion to make the increase. Laura 2nd. Because this is a shared expense with Svea, it will be brought to Joint Council this month.
 - d) Building and Maintenance:
 - i. Basement storage room window replacement Lee Franklin getting estimates
- ii. Pastor Parking sign Jill Sears, \$45; determine where to post. Lee Langer will work on installing.

e) Vanco Giving - charity opportunities

(From Pastor Al - The charity we were recognized for was Lutheran Social Services (LSS); we increased our giving by some needed percent and so our gifts were matched by an anonymous donor. Along with 49 other congregations (Svea included), we raised \$770,000 which was matched. Because of this, we were recognized as a "Loving Lutheran Congregation." There is an additional drive to raise money so LSS can reopen a L.E. Phillips Center in Chippewa Falls, which was a recovery center for addiction/chemical dependency—each dollar raised is matched by another anonymous donor. It is very easy to add another "giving square" on Vanco if we wanted to highlight LSS or any other cause.)

Would we like to offer this up in Vanco? Maybe even promote it over the next month that if anyone would like to make a special donation for this specific charity, they can donate via Vanco or check written out to the church but in the memo line write LSS?

Phyllis will work with Vanco to get a tile added to the online portal that members can use to donate to this if they choose. A check from Eidsvold will be written at the end of the giving period so it qualifies for the matched funds. Phylis will also check to be sure we are receiving the ELCA fee/rate when members are giving. Need to verify that compliance is being done every three months.

- f) This Sunday is Senior/Graduate Sunday. Any college graduates we should be recognizing? We are unsure of any college graduates; Pastor Al will ask during service if anyone should be recognized.
- g) Last day of Sunday school and Megan Franklin's last day as Sunday School Superintendent! Recommend \$50 Reuvers gift card and recognition during announcements. Include SS teachers in the announcement recognition, however, they will not be in attendance. Mandy will purchase gifts for SS teachers and a special gift for Megan.
- 4) Old Business
 - a) Church Cleanup learnings:
- i. Announce on Sunday the need for members to take turns to sign up to clean. Offer support to help new members who aren't familiar with where supplies are and what we do? Pass sign up sheet around on Sunday.
 - b) Other?

Financial Report given by Treasurer Phyllis.

Checking balance is \$178,975.53 as of 4/1/25. That total includes memorial fund \$26,575.26 / Youth \$1,935.05 / Building \$24,252.58 / Parsonage \$37,196.62

The offerings collected during Lent will be designated towards our World hunger mission. Phyllis will send a check for \$500.
