Greetings from the Parsonage,

Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote that he did not truly understand Advent until he was in prison. There, so much of his day revolved around waiting for a door to be thrown open and a new reality to step in. It is a far cry from a scene of gingerbread, lights, and tinsel, but his experience captures the heart of Advent. In this season, we wait for God to throw open the door and step into our lives. Waiting can bother us. As a general rule, Americans are busy people with busy lives who do not like to wait. In preparation for this article, I read far too many studies on the decline of patience in this country—something that ultimately affects us all. If you have ever scarfed down a meal so you can get back to work, or bought rice with the word "instant" on it, or flipped the channel during a commercial break, or felt a rush of frustration with traffic, then you know exactly what I mean. We do not like to wait, because it challenges our sense of control—our ability to make demands upon the world. This does not make us any worse than any other human being in this world, just in need of Advent more than ever before—a season when God asks us to wait. I love Christmas: the sights, the smells, the carols, the traditions that tie my family together through generations, a church full of strangers and friends singing as they rarely do—and Advent asks me to wait for those things. Why? Why not celebrate with gusto all the way through December? Why not jump to the manger? Because waiting forces us to realize that we are not in

There is beauty in waiting, if we stop and look for it. Some of the most meaningful moments of my life came during times when it was clear that I was not in control, but rather had to wait for God to throw open a door. This waiting brought conversations I never would have had, thoughts that I would have otherwise buried in work and distraction, realizations that take time to form. You might call this the hold music of life—moments when God sets a beat and rhythm and begs us to move along.

Like most periods of waiting, we know the end result of Advent—for us a Savior is born! We can practice patience this Advent because we know, Jesus is coming into the world and bringing with Him twelve whole days of celebration. I encourage you to lean into the waiting this year. How might our Advent hymns, wreath, and readings open your ears to the places that God calls you to give up control wait for Him to throw open the door? Wait and see.

I leave you with a prayer by Bonhoeffer.

control, but rather, live on God's terms and on God's time.

Lord Jesus, come yourself, and dwell with us, be human as we are, and overcome what overwhelms us. Come into the midst of my evil, come close to my unfaithfulness. Share my sin, which I hate and which I cannot leave. Be my brother, Thou Holy God. Be my brother in the kingdom of evil and suffering and death. Come with me in my death, come with me in my suffering, come with me as I struggle with evil. And make me holy and pure, despite my sin and death. Amen.

OLD BUSINESS:

Reformation program with the Sunday School kids was amazing. Everyone very happy with how the Sunday School turnout has been. The kids did great!

- ·Cleanup at the cemetery went very well. Was quick and efficient with many hands helping.

NEW BUSINESS:

·Had a discussion on what the church needs for new building insurance.

·Alvin Eidem presented a furnace quote from Lund Heating & AC for replacing motors on the 2 furnaces with refurbished motors which would save money. Right now they are working fine but the 2 furnaces are 20 years old. Laura P was going to contact someone else to come and give us a second opinion.

·Chili Feed potluck after a service, possibly Super Bowl Sunday. Most were in favor of that instead of having it on a Wednesday evening. No decisions yet.

Discussion had on what we pay towards parsonage vs. Svea. Wanted to get everyone on the same page before the joint council meeting on 11/13. Eidsvold pays \$583 (50% of rental value \$1166) plus 58% utilities appox \$177

5 Year Plan revisit

·Continued discussion on the 5 year plan; windows, water leakage. Since gutters installed seems OK right now. To be continued.

·Discussed Parsonage

- A railing needs to be installed going down to the basement for safety reasons.
- A rental agreement needs to drawn up for the tenant to sign and the council will do a walk through every year before the signing of it to make sure everything is satisfactory.

Church Membership List; Went through the church membership list line by line to determine what our current membership is and who is active and not active. Again, with Joint Council on 11/13 this will be used to determine percentage each church pays.
