Warm Greetings from the Parsonage! Reflection Psalm 98

(I would encourage you to read the 98th Psalm before reading this article)

"Oh sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things!"

What I love about the 98th Psalm is just how pushy the author is. I think that's fair to say. The Psalmist—whoever it is, the 98th is anonymous—doesn't accept the bare minimum, a polite smile at the end of our prayers. No! Because our Lord is so great and mighty, the Psalmist orders us to make a joyful noise; and not just the people here in the room but everyone on earth. Not satisfied, with that, the Psalmist demands that the sea get involved, and that fills it—fish, squids, crustaceans, mermaids, submariners are to roar to God. Then the rivers, and the hills are commanded to join in. (How does a hill sing for joy?) But it's not just any old song that the Psalmist demands. They write: "Oh sing to the LORD a new song,"

The Psalmist doesn't say "sing a new song" because they don't like the Oldies channel on the radio, they want you to sing with newness. Or better yet, the Psalmist asks that you allow newness to sing through you, allow the source of everything New to create in and through you. Our God is a creator first and foremost; even His love and redemption are acts of creation. He died on the Cross in order to extinguish the end of creation, and prove to us that there is no past nor darkness nor old musty thing that He cannot make New.

Our God is the source of newness in this life, the source of everything truly new and pure in this world. To Sing a New Song, truly, is to allow God to sing through you. As people of faith, we are not called to imitation but rather vocation. We are not called to simply imitate who Jesus was but answer where He is calling us to be right now. Imitation becomes a checklist, it becomes a matter of clinging to the past, attempting to recycle a moment, trying to make ourselves into who we are not. Vocation is God's way of tying us to the present moment.

God wants to move through you to create this world anew. He gives you His own love, grace, and forgiveness—that which recreates your relationship with Him—so you might extend the same into the world—and allow God to recreate the relationships that define your life. We just have to move our musty old selves out of His way. In death, we get out of God's way entirely and let Him go to work. Everything old is left at the grave, and in us, and through us, God sings a new song, a song of new creation, a song of salvation.
