Greetings from the Parsonage!

Although most of you have read the Gospel of Mark, this was not Mark's original intent—he composed to be heard. In the earliest days of the church, folks would gather in houses and courtyards and listen to Mark tell the story of the Gospel. The ancient world delighted in master storytellers—if you think of Homer and his Iliad and Odyssey—and so God's Church met that world where they were, on the terms that they were most familiar. At some point, Mark dictated the Gospel so others could tell the story as well—eventually, that written text was all that remained.

On the fifth Sunday of June our parish is going to put on the Gospel of Mark. A friend of mine works with InterVarsity Christian Fellowship at UW-Madison and the Mark Drama is a part of their regular ministry. He has agreed to come and direct us through the process here. The "script" is taken directly from the Bible, there are no costumes and very few props. The Drama calls for 14-16 volunteers from the congregation. This play isn't aiming for a blue ribbon, so no need to worry about acting experience or natural skill. For the rest of the parish, this will simply a rare opportunity to hear the Gospel in a different way.

Like the original Gospel, the Mark Drama is meant to be a gateway into a relationship with God. Let's be real, it is way easier to invite a friend to "come see the play I'm in," then to invite them to church. What's reassuring is that this has always been the case—Mark found a new way to share the Gospel and one that can help us do the same today. As Ecclesiastes tells us, "there is nothing new under the sun." What appears new to us is so often very old and, in the case of the Mark Drama, the concept is as possible. If you are interested in being a part of this play, please connect with me. There are only three rehearsals—Thursday night, Friday night, and most of Saturday, with a performance on Sunday morning. The goal is not perfection but experience.

We are exploring options for a venue but are always open to suggestion—the hope is to hold the drama somewhere in the vicinity of Hager or Bay City.




