Education is one of the strongest tools for breaking poverty, and educating girls has even stronger results. School kit supplies help children—and adults-learn which




leads to a better life for them, their families, and their communities.

Have you ever heard of Have A Heart in River Falls? They provide services for families with physically and/or developmentally disabled loved ones.

Have a Heart opened its doors in 1994 to provide children's


respite services. Since then, they have expanded their services to include an adult family home, an adult day program, and adult respite for weekends. They provide specialized care for each of their clients.

They currently have a goal of buying a wheelchair accessible van to provide transportation and community outings for their clients. Their current adults day care program provides engaging and person centered activities for five individuals from Pierce and St. Croix Counties and with a new van, they hope to enroll eight more clients into their program. The adult day care program includes transportation to and from the center, meals, and personal care.

Have A. Heart, Inc. is licensed by the State of Wisconsin to serve children and adults. They are a Wisconsin 501 (3)(c) charitable organization, governed by a Board of Directors. When they get a new van, they will sell their current vehicles which don't meet the needs of all clients.

THE CHURCH AT WORK . . .

- The 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the church, convenes Aug. 8-12 in Columbus, Ohio. This year's theme is "Embody the Word," based on Luke 24:45. Voting members will participate in worship and discussions while acting on key legislative business and hearing reports and updates on the work of the church. To follow along with the assembly from home, livestream the proceedings at ELCA.org/cwa.
- Lutheran Social Services of WI reports nearly 200 refugees and Afghan evacuees have settled in WI and other parts of the US and now have peace and hope. Congregations and communities donated funds, gift cards, cellphones, laptops as well as collected supplies, cleaned, painted, and readied apartments and walked along side their new neighbors, helping them navigate bus routes, grocery stores, pharmacies and other day-to day activities. One Afghani man, quadriplegic, and in need of critical medical attention when he arrived is now serving as an interpreter on the LSS Refugee Resettlement team. Through our congregational support of LSS, God's love has been brought to each of these new arrivals.
- Lutheran Disaster Response is faithfully responding to humanitarian and refugee needs in Ukraine and accompanying churches and partners in neighboring countries. They are also responding to the many tornadoes, fires, and floods that have swept throughout the US. In 2021, Lutheran Disaster Response was present in 47 countries and 17 US states and territories following Christ's call to share hope and healing with our neighbors. In 2022 Lutheran Disaster Response is working in an additional 11 countries and 6 states and territories. Gifts to support people whose lives been upended by disaster may be sent to:
